Palm Sunday March 24, 2024

Let the Church lead you.

Happy Palm Sunday or Blessed Passion Sunday! In some ways, I'm not sure how to begin this article. At the beginning, we joyously celebrate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem with a grand procession. However, it doesn't take long in the liturgy to move from this joyous and triumphant entry to all of us in the Passion yelling, "Crucify Him." This, in part, is why you hear the two names for this weekend 'Palm Sunday' or 'Passion Sunday.' One thing is for sure. This Sunday is the beginning of the time known as 'Holy Week'. This is the holiest week of the Church year.

In the image of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, I picture the apostles being His entourage and St. Peter holding the rope as He rides on the donkey. This is a beautiful foreshadowing for us today. The apostles represent the church and they are leading us into Holy Week, with Jesus at the center of it all.

Allow this week and the church to lead you into Holy Week to the heart of Jesus. The church encourages us all to participate in as much as we can throughout this week. First, if you haven't been to confession, please go. This will open you up fully to receive the graces of this week. If possible, go to daily Mass, but if not, enter into the Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday) as much as possible.

Holy Thursday is a beautiful Mass where we have the "washing of the feet" which is a celebration of the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood. Also, we have that time of silent prayer after Mass in our side chapel. Good Friday commemorates the Lord's Passion and we have the opportunity to venerate the Cross. Holy Saturday begins in darkness, but the light breaks into the church and Christ dispels our darkness and we celebrate Jesus' Triumph over sin and death. This Liturgy also welcomes our newest members into the church through baptism and confirmation. This Mass and celebration is the high point of these three days and welcomes the Easter Season.

After this, we celebrate Easter with an Octave. Beginning Easter Day and ending the following Sunday, the Church recognizes this event is **so** big, that we can't celebrate it in just one day. So each day for eight days, we celebrate Easter Day. These past 40 days and this upcoming week, are all for **this** moment of supreme importance. Allow the Church to lead you, join us this Holy Week. Fr. Tom
